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KEY ACTIVITIES

Creation of a Language Learning and Life Skills Catalogue

Multilingual online training modules (English, Italian, German, Greek, Dutch) combining language learning and key skills for personal and professional development, based on the CLIL methodology (Content and Language Integrated Learning) and organized into short lessons (microlearning), easily accessible even for learners with limited language and digital skills.

Creation of the Informative and Training Toolkit on Intersectionality

Guidelines, tools, and case studies to support professionals in understanding the different intersecting dimensions that need to be considered in order to promote and implement inclusive, equitable policies and practices that are aware of multiple inequalities.



Development of an e-learning platform

An inclusive, multilingual, and mobile-friendly digital environment designed to support migrant women's learning and the training of professionals. It will host the Learning Catalogue and the Intersectionality Toolkit, offering short, interactive, and customizable learning pathways. It will remain a free and open resource even after the end of the project.
